Aims:

1. To examine materials used to build, furnish and equip St Edith's Church.
2. To record materials used in the church.

Target group(s):

Key Stage Two

Resources:

Data sheets.

Activity outline:

1. Discuss what materials are used in the classroom and school.
2. Discuss materials that are used in the children's homes.
3. This activity must take place in the church.
4. Children look round church and record various parts and what they are made of.

Follow-up work:

1. Transfer all children's data onto master spreadsheet.
2. Make a similar record of materials used in school and homes.
